

# CODE OF CONDUCT

## Purpose:

The Different Journeys Autism Peer Support Events have been created to empower the autistic individuals and their families/carers by providing a social platform and community. The platform encourages a safe and supportive environment in which they can build relationships and create connections with their peers.

To ensure that everyone who attends any Different Journeys event feels safe and comfortable there is a need to follow a set of rules also called a Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct ensures that there is an inclusive, safe and supportive environment for everyone, and that Different Journeys is represented as a respectful and professional organisation.

It is expected that all attendees will:

- Be polite;
- Be respectful;
- Act in a way that does not offend any person;
- Participate in creating and maintaining a safe environment for everyone;
- Be open and honest;
- Tell us if you need help;
- Talk to us in a calm manner if you are not happy about any aspect associated with Different Journeys.



It is expected that all attendees WILL NOT:

- Possess or use illegal drugs or weapons at Different Journeys' events;
- Use rude language or behaviour;
- Use bad behaviour that is unsafe for yourself and those around you;
- Threaten or use actual violence;
- Bully or harass whether verbal, physical or visual;
- Be unfair to any person associated with Different Journeys;
- Fail to cooperate with any person/organisation associated with Different Journeys.



Please note: You are expected to follow these rules as an individual or as a group associated with Different Journeys.
